(sourced & trained a local instructor delivering fun exercise – couples encouraged) N Stroud Members Meeting

Built Our Own Website:

Created, built / developed, and maintained. The go-to place for all information on our activities and news of updates related to Parkinson's. Cheltenham Branch have 'cloned' our website for their own use.

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We also achieved the following: -

- Finalist Cirencester Chamber of Commerce Awards for "Team of the Year"
- Winner Cirencester Community Awards for "Team of the Year"
- Initiated a project to establish the benefits of Drumming as Therapy for PwP
- Initiated a project to determine the benefits of a Recumbent Bike for PwP

We planned four main fundraising projects (Jan-23 – Dec23):

April – Branch Event: Paul Mayhew-Archer comedy show - The Incurable Optimist (£5,599.26)

May – Branch Event: Hill & Valley Singers (£1,500 donation)

May – Joint Branch Event: Clubbing Together Golf Day (£517 to branch, £6,700 to research)) Jun – Additional Event: Minchinhampton Gardening Club (£144)

Sep & Dec – Branch Event: PPU6 Awareness Concert (£5,269.03)

Total raised from our involvement - £19,729.29.

(£13,029.29 paid direct to our Branch Account from the above events plus £6,700 was paid directly to Parkinson's UK research)

It was proposed at the AGM by Kath Clements, seconded by Janie Bates, and agreed by all members present, that a sum of £5k from the 2023 year-end account balance would be donated, with a potential of a further donation later in the Year dependant on the result of any fundraising efforts. A number of options as to where to donate to where discussed: Options are:

• Research – (note if it was agreed to go to research, then the Branch is to agree which project it is to go to)

- · Where the need is greatest
- Financial Assistance Programme
- To Support work in your region
- Improving Services

It was agreed that this decision would be made later. Options are to be circulated to all members for a consensus along with potential research projects.
